

## LEGAL NOTICE

### Miner Lake Improvement Board Allegan County, MI

#### HEARING OF PRACTICABILITY AND HEARING OF ASSESSMENT

TAKE NOTICE that the Miner Lake Improvement Board will hold a public hearing on August 30, 2014 at 9:30 a.m., at the Allegan Township Hall located at 3037 118<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Allegan Michigan, to determine the practicability of a five-year improvement project for Miner Lake. The lake improvement project would include nuisance aquatic plant control, plant control coordination/field surveys, water quality and aquatic vegetation monitoring, administration, and contingencies. The project would begin in 2015 and continue through 2019, with an annual cost of \$25,000. **Additional information regarding the proposed scope and cost of the program is enclosed.**

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that a special assessment roll has been prepared and is on file at the Allegan Township Hall located at 3037 118<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Allegan, Michigan for public examination during normal business hours. Said special assessment roll has been prepared for the purpose of assessing the cost of the improvement project to benefiting properties.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that the Miner Lake Improvement Board will hold a hearing of assessment immediately following the aforementioned hearing of practicability for the purpose of reviewing said special assessment roll and for hearing any objections thereto. An owner of or party with interest in real property to be assessed or his/her agent may appear in person to object to the special assessment or may protest such special assessment by letter filed with the Lake Board at or prior to the time of the hearing, in which case personal appearance is not required. Written objections may be filed with or mailed to the Miner Lake Improvement Board c/o Jane Waanders, Allegan Township Hall, 3037 118<sup>th</sup> Avenue, Allegan, Michigan 49010.

NOTICE IS FURTHER GIVEN that the owner of or any party with interest in real property within the Miner Lake Special Assessment District who, having protested said special assessment either in person or in writing, may, within thirty (30) days after the confirmation of the special assessment roll has been published in a newspaper of general circulation, appeal such special assessment to the Michigan Tax Tribunal or other court of competent jurisdiction.

The above-referenced hearings are being held pursuant to Part 309 of Public Act No. 451 of 1994 as amended.
